

Noise Alert!

This is a reminder to all Winter Park (and, Orlando as well) residents that the noise codes of the city, (Chapter 18, section 18-17 (1) and Chapter 62, section 62-96 a & b) include nuisance dog barking. Within the last couple of months, there have been several instances of a couple dogs barking for over an hour, with no attention from their owners. One was late at night, after 11 pm. If anyone is bothered by a barking dog for this length of time, over and over, it is appropriate to call the code enforcement office, and they will send someone out to investigate. PLEASE, do not let your pet be a nuisance to your neighbors. Now that the weather is nice, and people have their windows open, it's even more important that we watch our noise levels.

GET READY TO VOTE

Two former Winter Park commissioners are campaigning to be the city's next mayor. Voters decide on March 9 whether Phil Anderson or Sarah Sprinkel will replace outgoing Mayor Steve Leary to represent the city of about 30,000 residents. Early Voting: March 1-5, 8am-5pm daily (at the Supervisor of Elections office only). Election Day: Tuesday, March 9, 7am-7pm.

WINTER PARK PRIDE PROJECT'S 1000 FLAG INITIATIVE

Long-time Winter Park resident and business owner, Thor Falk, announced the formation of The Winter Park PRIDE Project, a not for profit 501(c)(3) corporation. The mission is to promote and celebrate that Winter Park is a diverse and inclusive community where everyone is wel-

come



The initiative for 2021 is to provide 1,000 residents with free Pride flags to fly outside their homes in Winter Park during PRIDE month, June 2021. Fundraising efforts will cover the cost of the Pride flags and excess funds will be dedicated to organizations and programs benefiting LGBTQ+ youth or promoting diversity and inclusion in Winter Park.

Explaining his motivation, Falk said, "I believe these flags will give Winter Park residents an opportunity to show their support and, in doing so, help LGBTQ+

people of all ages to know they are a valued part of the Winter Park community."

Falk is in the process of assembling a Board of Directors for the Winter Park PRIDE Project and hopes to include

NEIGHBORHOOD PRO SPRING GARDENING TIPS

Since it is now time to start pruning your shrubs and perennials, this article is on proper pruning methods. Let's start with deadheading. This is a term referring to cutting off spent flowers. Most perennials and annuals benefit from deadheading, not only because it makes them more attractive, but because it gets rids of dead material and rejuvenates the plant. As I walk the neighborhood, the plant I most see



that needs deadheading is the ubiquitous penta. Please, neighbors, get out there and deadhead your pentas! A penta

covered in brown dried up flowers is so unattractive! Once the dead flowers are gone, the plant then sets about to produce more blooms. It only takes checking the yard just once a week to see what needs

attention. Most annuals benefit from deadheading - there are some exceptions, petunias for one, but go ahead and cut them off when in doubt. If your shrubs and perennials have been "bitten" by the cold, now is the time to prune off the brown portion back to where the stem is still green. You can find this point by gently scratching the bark to find where the green starts. Make your cut slightly diagonal, at a leaf or twig node. It's important to use sharp pruners (the knife sharpener at the Winter Park Farmers' Market also sharpens garden tools). For shrubs, generally, it's best to take off no more than a third of the plant's size. For flowering shrubs, wait until blooming is over. Remember that pruning will encourage plants to produce new growth, so it's a good idea to give them the first dose of fertilizer of the year. As always, be sure to follow label instructions for applying fertilizer. It is recommended that you use a slow release granular type.


