## OMWA ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

- Over 30 neighborhood households were represented at the annual meeting hosted by one of our sponsors, Commerce Bank & Trust located at Orlando and Harmon Avenues.
- Two long serving board members retired Suzan Goldin had served for 21 years and Tim Schulte for seven years. Their many years of contributions are greatly appreciated. Suzan will continue to serve as one of the judges for Halloween and Christmas decorations. Tim will be moving to another house in Winter Park.
- We welcomed two new board members Ramon Caudle resides on Orange Avenue and Mark Snedeker hails from Westchester Ave.
- Winter Park Police Officer Christopher Bellcore reported there were minimal neighborhood incidents over the last year. He advised that locking automobiles and removing valuables from them is critical for deterring break-ins.



- In a prelude to the upcoming Centennial Celebration, I provided an overview of how to do in-person or online research with the Orange County Regional History Center on the history of your home and/or our neighborhood. The information is posted at www.orwinmanor.org and in our park. Please share with us what you discover.
- The FDOT Orange Avenue lane reduction is still funded and we await word on the date for a spring public hearing. The proposed roundabout at Clay and Wilkinson is currently unfunded and unscheduled.

- Board member Penny Potter recapped the many events from the past year: Great Pumpkin Decorating, Witches' Walk, Orwin Manor Aglow, Santa's visit, luminaries, and the bi-monthly Yard of Distinction.
- The Centennial Committee report noted five subcommittees: Events (including block parties with food trucks!), Historic Research, Projects (including 100 Trees for 100 Years, an historical marker in The Park at Orwin Manor, and restoration of the missing Orange Ave. gates at Orlando Ave.), Public Relations, and Sponsorships. ### Neighborhood Pro – Spring Gardening Tips (

For those of you who still have your poinsettias (native to Mexico), give a thought to planting them in the ground, and enjoying them again next Christmas. Select a sunny spot in the yard where they will not get any nighttime light. Plant the root ball even with the ground level, and keep moist until they become established, at least 3-4 months. When the bracts (the colored portions) start to fade, cut them off, leaving 4-6 inches of stem and as many green leaves as possible. Feed March-October with a slowrelease fertilizer (i.e., Osmocote) following label instructions. If the branches become leggy, prune them back to within 12-18 inches above the ground before mid-September. Good luck!

Trim off any cold damaged portions on your cold-sensitive plants. Use sharp pruners, cut at a slight angle just below the damaged area. It's also time for the first feeding of the year, with slow-release fertilizer, to your perennials, shrubs and the lawn with the proper fertilizer for your lawn type.

• Historic Home Demolition - The 1925 historic house at 1475 Berkshire Avenue is slated to be demolished and replaced with two houses on its 150-foot-wide lot. Unfortunately, the previous owners did not place it on the WP Historic Register. Previous residents included Frances Murrah whose son Kenneth Murrah became a lawyer and supported our neighborhood association with pro-bono services. Kenneth's wife Rachel was a Winter Park city commissioner and in 1990 she led the charge for Winter Park's purchase of the land where The Park at Orwin Manor resides. Prior residents include the Ness family which has an engraved sidewalk panel in our park. • AT&T Under Grounding (only along part of Orange Ave.) -Within the next three to five months, AT&T will be installing cables by underground boring in the right-of-way along the east side of Orange Avenue in Orlando for 10 residences. The vaults typically placed at the property lines will vary in size and be flush with the ground. Once completed it could take some time for old aboveground terminals to be removed since all customers must first switch over to the new network. Each home should receive a notice 3-7 days prior to construction. They promise that everything will be returned to prior condition. • Duke Energy Under Grounding (along Berkshire and Westchester Avenues) - Irby, the Duke Energy contractor should have overhead wires removed by mid-March. That is followed by restoration work by their sub-contractor. This should include replacement of broken sidewalks, removal of excess soil, and replacement of damaged plants including sod. Soil levels should be three inches below the top of sidewalks, curbs, and driveways so sod is not too high, and mulch does not wash out. Report issues and your address to us. Sadly, the power poles will not be removed or even lowered at this time as they are being purchased by a communications company.

• Spectrum Under Grounding - Spectrum is ALSO under grounding in our neighborhood but never contacted us. Look for the light green cylinders to see where they have already been. At this time, we have not discovered what area they are covering. If you want updates, sign up for the Orwin Manor E-News at www.orwinmanor.org.

#### **Election Sign Recycling**

Winter Park residents are encouraged to bring their signs and stands beginning Monday, March 7, at noon, through Monday, March 21, to Fire Station 64 located at 1439 Howell Branch Road. This recycling initiative will prevent an abundance of yard signs from going to a local landfill. Instead, the signs will be transported to NuCycle Energy where they will be transformed from bulky discarded plastic to NuCycle's Enviro Fuelcubes. The Fuelcubes are then sold to Cemex, a large regional cement manufacturer, where they are used to generate electricity, replacing coal as a cleaner energy source.
