OMWA PRESIDENT'S REPORT

EVENTS R US – Our association was founded in 1983 and by 1988 board members were eager to hold an outdoor neighborhood-wide gathering. Unfortunately, Orwin Manor Westminster did not have any park space. So, the association made do and held a street party in the grassy triangle at the intersection of Pelham and Westminster. There was some overflow beyond the curbs, but traffic was light, and the surprised drivers slowed when they saw a gathering of adults and kids clustered into a small space surrounded by asphalt. Fast forward about six years and The Park at Orwin Manor was then under construction with its dedication occurring on October 24, 1994. In the nearly 28 years the park has hosted over 100 association events. Passersby have seen Santas, Easter bunnies overseeing egg hunts, Mardi Gras, ghouls, kids on slip n' slides and with water blasters, clowns, potlucks, chalk painting, and more.

Mark your calendars! In October, the park will witness two continuing long-term events – **Oktoberfest** and **Witches Walk**. For Oktoberfest (Sunday, October 9 from 4:30 onward), bring beverages and a yummy dish (with serving

utensils) to share. OMWA will provide hotdogs, bratwurst, condiments, and paper goods/utensils. Feel free to bring your own reusables to cut down on waste. There will be tables so bring chairs if you wish.

Witches Walk has become an institution that not sur-

prisingly occurs on Halloween night (Monday, October 31 from 6:30-8) just as trick-or-treating comes alive. Volunteers scavenge gnarly branches and Spanish moss and retrieve decorations from our storage unit and meet at about 2 p.m. in the park. Within a few hours the park is temporarily transformed into what becomes an enchanting and a bit ghoulish event that attracts hundreds of kids and adults. Volunteers are needed again this year. Some activities are held neighborhood-wide instead of in the park. The **Great Pumpkin Decoration Judging** takes place on Thursday, October 20 after 6 p.m. Winners have a sign posted and they are featured in the MYM. Other events include December's **Orwin Manor Aglow** contest and the **Christmas Eve Luminaries**.

One of the largest events OMW will ever see is its Centennial in 2024 with events starting in 2023. (Sadly, none of us will be here for the bicentennial in 2124.) Plans are underway to commemorate and celebrate with multiple events and projects including block parties, an historical marker at the park, tree plantings, and historic house designations culminating with a bash in the park in the fall of 2024. AROUND THE CORNER

ELECTION SIGN BLUES? *Check out this great regional partnership.*

The City of Winter Park's Sustainability Division is partnering with the League of Women Voters of Orange County Natural Resources Committee to recycle election signs including stands generated from the recent primary and upcoming midterm election campaign seasons. This recycle effort is being conducted in collaboration with the City of Orlando and Orange County Offices of Sustainability & Resilience.

Winter Park residents are encouraged to bring their campaign signs and stands to be recycled on the following dates to the following locations:

Primary election campaign sign drop-off dates: August 19-September 6.

General election campaign sign drop-off dates: November 4-23.

Winter Park drop-off locations:

- Cady Way at 2529 Cady Way
- Mead Botanical Garden Community Garden at 1310 South Denning Drive
- Fire Station 64 at 1439 Howell Branch Road

The recycling initiative will prevent an abundance of yard signs from going to a local landfill. Instead, the signs will be transported to NuCycle Energy where they will be transformed from bulky discarded plastic to NuCycle's Enviro Fuelcubes. Fuelcubes are used to generate electricity, replacing coal as a cleaner energy source.

This partnership with the league was first initiated during the November 2020 campaign season. At the conclusion of the drive, over 15,000 signs were successfully recycled in Winter Park instead of being disposed in a local landfill.

100 Years Ago in 1922...

- In Florida, an orange crop of 16 million boxes, the largest ever known to this date is harvested. The 2021/2022 crop is estimated to be 45 million boxes which is way below the 244 million box record.
- Rollins Avenue, Chapman Avenue, and Chase Avenue, is closed from Kentucky (Holt) Avenue to Lake Virginia, becoming a part of the Rollins College campus.
- Mohandas Gandhi is arrested in Bombay for sedition.
- In The Bronx, construction begins on Yankee Stadium.
- President Warren G. Harding makes his first speech on the radio.
- The first issue of Reader's Digest is published in the United States.
- In Egypt, English archaeologist Howard Carter and his men find the entrance to Pharaoh Tutankhamun's tomb in the Valley of the Kings. Within two weeks Carter and Lord Carnavon become the first people to see inside the tomb of Pharaoh Tutankhamun, in over 3,000 years.

NEIGHBORHOOD PRO SPRING GARDENING TIPS

By the time this newsletter is out, we'll be coming into the fall weather pattern. It'll still be hot for a while, but the daylight hours are continuing to decrease, and the sun is not quite so intense. The numerous deciduous trees will be losing their leaves, just like in temperate climates, although most without the glorious coloring. Some of the more common Florida deciduous trees are crape myrtle, winged elm, vitex (chaste tree), Chickasaw plum, sycamore, and river birch. If possible, use the fallen leaves as mulch, raking them up, and spreading them in your planting beds. Larger leaves, such as sycamore leaves, may need some chopping up before spreading. A 2-3" deep layer is sufficient, and make sure you keep the mulch about 6"-8" away from trunks.

An established tree (2-3 years old) doesn't re-

ally need much fertilizer - if you fertilize the lawn surrounding the tree, that should be sufficient. The same applies to watering trees and shrubs - once they're well established, they normally don't need additional irrigation other than rainfall. If the weather has been unusually hot, and there's been no significant rainfall, then a supplemental watering might be called for.

Palms, which are not trees at all, need fertilizing with a palm-specific product. It's best to wait until October, for the last feeding until next spring.
