OMWA PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The OMW Centennial program 100 Trees for 100 Years encourages the planting of trees throughout the neighborhood. The benefits of the shade that trees provide include lower power bills and a spot for a seating area or hammock. Trees also provide wildlife habitat, absorption of carbon dioxide and stormwater, higher property values, and free leaf mulch.

While many street trees have been planted, there are numerous yards throughout our neighborhood that have space for canopy/shade trees and/or smaller understory trees. They all count toward our 100 Trees for 100 Years goal.

Canopy/shade trees such as oaks, bald cypress, winged elms, and magnolias may reach 60 to 80 feet in height. Plant these away from the house at about one-half of their potential height. Understory/accent trees including trumpet/ tabebuia, ligustrum, crape myrtle, Simpson's stopper, and yaupon holly trees provide a good sense of scale and will rarely overwhelm a house. They tuck into smaller spaces and the ones that tolerate some shade will fit in between shade trees. For all potential trees to plant, be aware of the mature height and spread and other characteristics.

Neighborhood Update

The Banning of Gas-powered Leaf Blowers in Winter Park

By ordinance, in July of 2024 the use of gas-powered leaf blowers by ANYONE in Winter Park will no longer be allowed. However, the transition to corded or

battery-operated electric blowers (or even brooms and rakes) could start at any time and should start earlier. You are encouraged to communicate your desire to have your landscape maintenance contractor transition equipment to electric well before the deadline. The benefits of eliminating gas-powered blowers include:

1. Less noise pollution (plus no need for them to idle)

2. No combustion engine fumes and no emissions at the source. Generation of electricity is less polluting and a portion is from clean energy.

- 3. No gas and oil pollution
- 4. Less weight to carry
- 5. Reduction of hearing loss
- 6. Longer life for equipment

If you are purchasing an electric battery-Electric blowers only in 2024. powered blower, look for one that uses batteries compatible with other equipment such as string

trimmers, power shears, chainsaws, and mowers. For smaller properties a corded version may be the best choice.

Homeowners will be responsible for making sure gas-powered blowers are no longer used on their property.

EARLY SUMMER GARDENING TIPS BY BOARD MEMBER & ORANGE CO. MASTER GARDENER PENNY POTTER

Here are some suggestions of veggies that do well in the hot summer months to come: Calabaza, a tropical squash; Chayote, another squash that will need a trellis to climb; boniato, often called Cuban sweet potatoes, okra, southern peas and sweet potatoes. If you just have to have tomatoes, try varieties with small fruit, but check frequently for fungal & other pest problems that are so prevalent in the summer. It's unlikely that you will get much of a crop.

Now is the time to bake out nematodes and other pests in the soil, using Soil Solarization. Prepare the plot (or raised bed) as for planting, mix in organic matter, cover the plot or bed with clear (not black) plastic, and anchor it along the edges. Leave to bake for at least 7-8 weeks or longer. This method works best when the area gets a full day of sun. When it's time for planting remove the plastic, and plant without much disturbing of the soil.

Once the regular summer rains start TURN OFF YOUR IRREGATION SYSTEM. The rain sensor should prevent it from coming on if there's been a good rain the night before, but it can't sense rain in the future! If there's been no rain for a few days, go ahead and turn the system on manually. You can tell if your grass needs rain by the curling up of the edges of the blades.

Guidelines for Successful Tree Planting and Establishment

Use these guidelines to plant your new tree. If you hire a landscape contractor, make them part of your agreement.

1. You may have room above ground for a tree but is there room below ground? Before the purchase, dig the hole so you know the root ball will fit. Be a pessimist and assume there may be large roots or utilities in the way. If there isn't another location, a smaller tree or no tree may be the result. A tree in the wrong place is worse than no tree at all.

2. As the test hole is dug, temporarily place the excavated soil on tarps or into containers so the soil doesn't get mixed up with the mulch or smother plants. Planting a tree should enhance the garden and not destroy it.

3. Remove all non-biodegradable coverings and wire baskets and even biodegradable burlap if the root ball is firm. Trees with root choked root balls usually languish after planting. Sometimes the tree can transcend a too-tight root ball if the roots are seriously loosened just prior to planting. Often the bottom of a root packed root ball should be butterflied. Remove any roots that circle the trunk.

4. Find the top main root at the trunk and if needed remove soil to expose the root. Then to determine the depth for the hole, measure the depth of the root ball and subtract two-to-three inches so the top root ends up above the existing grade. If you dig too deep compact the soil in the bottom so the tree does not settle later. Then dig sideways so the hole is wider than the root ball by about fifty-percent. Check the depth again.

5. As the hole is backfilled, water in the soil to fill air pockets around the root ball and do not add any soil amendments or fertilizer. According to research they are not needed.

6. Place the inner edge of the three-inch-high soil saucer/donut just inside the outer edge of the root ball so when filled, the water only sits on top of the root ball and doesn't drain down its side. Add no more than a one-inch depth of mulch to the top of the root ball so water easily penetrates. Keep mulch four inches away from the trunk.

7. Excess soil not used in the saucer should be used to fill low spots or be removed from the property.

8. Don't count on irrigation or rainfall, or reset the automatic irrigation to water everything every day just to water the tree. Instead, buy a battery-operated timer for a hose bibb and run a hose to the saucer. Fill the saucer with about two to three gallons of water per inch of trunk diameter every day at first during the summer. Following the initial few months of frequent irrigation, provide weekly irrigation until plants are fully established. At each irrigation, apply 2 to 3 gallons of water per inch trunk diameter (e.g., 2 to 6 gallons for a 2-inch tree) over the root ball only. Any more than that is wasteful.

10. Once the tree is established (about three months per inch of trunk diameter if watered regularly) dispose of the soil saucer and make sure the top main root is still exposed.

Follow these steps and a well-planted and established tree will be a great addition to your garden and the environment.
