- Don't miss our Third Annual Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, March 30th from 10 a.m. to noon in The Park at Orwin Manor!

- Your zone has changed and the use of South Florida plants continues to creep northward! As our planet continues to warm, the USDA Hardiness Zone Map (based on lowest annual winter temperature) is updated again and Central Florida is now Zone 10a (formerly 9b) 30 to 35 degrees.
- Oak leaves make great mulch. Bag some to use throughout the year.
- WP City Commissioner Sheila DeCiccio joined us at the January 9th OMWA Annual Meeting and heard a complaint about the frequently malfunctioning traffic light at Orange and 17/92. She contacted city staff the next day and he worked with FDOT to address the issue. Hongmyung Lim's response: "There was an issue not too long ago where we had 5 officers on-site as well as our signal folks at this intersection. The preemption for the railroad tracks was not functioning properly, resulting in the signal to not function as designed. Our team coordinated with the railroad team and addressed the issue. Another angle is Metroplan Orlando is currently working with the City and FDOT to retime all of the signals along 426 and 17-92 corridors. I had a kick off meeting with them yesterday, and I actually did inform their team that the most calls we get at this intersection is the left turns. They mentioned that when they do their field visits and see any issues, then they will keep me informed of the issues and recommendations."

NEIGHBORHOOD PRO – THE USE OF MULCHES IN THE GARDEN

I'm frequently asked about which type of mulch is the best to use, and why is it so important. What follows is information from IFAS (UF School of Agriculture).

First and foremost, mulch helps prevent the spread of weeds. Also, it holds in moisture longer after rain or irrigation. It helps prevent soil erosion. It can be used as a ground cover in deeply shaded areas where nothing else will grow. It makes the whole landscape look neat and tidy.

As far as the kind of mulch to use, a lot depends on your personal preference as far as appearance. Non-organic mulch (rubber bits or rocks) does not contribute any organic matter (acts as fertilizer) to the soil, since they do not decompose, and may eventually settle under the surface of our sandy soil, and therefore are not recommended by UF. Bark mulches are sturdy and last a fairly long time, and look natural (except the colored ones). Cypress bark is not recommended by UF, as the trees are often cut from wild

wetlands. Melaleuca mulch is very desirable, as it comes from clearing the invasive melaleuca trees in South Florida, but it is hard to find here in Central Florida and may be expensive. Pine bark is the most common of bark mulches, is a byproduct of the lumber industry, and comes in several nugget sizes. Pine straw (pine needles) is inexpensive, especially if you rake it yourself, but it doesn't last as long as bark mulches. Leaves that are raked up from your yard - or others - are also inexpensive if you're raking or gathering bags left on the curb. However, they may shift around, and be carried off in a hard rain. Large leaves, like magnolia or sycamore leaves, should be mowed into smaller pieces. There are many IFAS publications on mulch, as well as all topics of horticulture, which you can easily access by entering IFAS after your search word in Google. LEAVES ARE FALLING!

Don't buy mulch!! Take those falling leaves and use them to mulch your plants up to a 4" depth. Keep them a few inches away from trunks and plant stems. Leaves hold moisture in the soil, keep out weeds, encourage earthworms and add nutrients to the soil. Spread them and bag some for future use.


