Jewell B. Hooper Park And The Arches

Orange Avenue and the railroad tracks. The two locations of the three remaining southern gateway arches at Wilkinson and Clay Streets in Orlando are also parks. At some point all of the "micro-parks" were deeded to either Orlando or Winter Park respectively and removed from the tax rolls.

The Orwin Manor Westminster Association obtained an aerial photo circa late 1920s, that shows there were two northern gateway arches flanking Orange Avenue. Those locations are within two of the parks deeded to Winter Park. One grassy triangular site is at the corner of 17/92 and Orange Avenue at The Hub building. Across Orange Avenue, the unassuming park at Harmon Avenue adjacent to a parking lot hosted one of the arches and contains a ground level plaque that reads:

This park is dedicated to Jewell B. Hooper 1896-1974 City of Winter Park Employee for 48 years

So, who was Mr. Hooper? With aid from an *Orlando Sentinel* article and information from Winter Park, I pieced together Hooper's background. In 1918 in northern France during WWI, Jewell B. Hooper and his comrades were bombed with gas and their lungs were burnt. 85 years later Hooper was posthumously

awarded the Purple Heart due to efforts by his grandson Charles Hooper.

Jewell Hooper was hospitalized for six months for those injuries to his lungs. After his hospitalization, he was honorably discharged. Jewell Hooper returned to Georgia and worked there for a few years, as a firefighter. In the 1920s, he and his wife, Althea, moved to Winter Park, where Althea's three sisters lived. The couple had three children.

He started working for the city, collecting garbage on a mule drawn wagon. Serving Winter Park for 48 years, he worked his way up to streets foreman. After retirement, Charles Hooper said, people at City Hall often would call his grandfather if they had technical questions.

Jewel Hooper died at the age of 78 and is interred at Palm Cemetery in Winter Park.

The Orwin Manor Westminster Association has reached out to the City of Winter Park to rebuild the two northern arches demolished decades ago. THE PETITION-REBUILD THE DEMOLISHED GATEWAY ARCHES

Those who travel along Orange Avenue no longer experience the two grand Orwin ⚠ Manor Gateway Arches demolished decades ago. While the 1924 southern arches still exist in Orlando and are on their historic register, the northern entryway to our historic neighborhood was destroyed along with part of our community's history and ambiance. They must be reborn.

The Orwin Manor Westminster Association found a circa late 1920s aerial photograph that showed the gateway arches located in city parks flanking Orange Avenue. Do you remember those gateway arches constructed with concrete, concrete block, stucco, and clay tile. Few if any do, since they have been lost to time. We found design professionals who worked pro bono to craft construction plans and a construction bid. These were submitted to Winter Park for inclusion in this next fiscal year's budget.

We petition the City of Winter Park to budget for and rebuild the missing Gateway Arches. While our voices are strong, the addition of your signatures and voices will create an impact that cannot be ignored.

Please join us in welcoming our newest OMWA Board Member, Bre-elle Ishtar.



Neighborhood Bits

It only took a light rain to bring down a street tree's huge limb. Canterbury Road neighbor Beth Miller was driving home and fortunately the tree limb missed her vehicle. Westchester Avenue at Canterbury Road was blocked until Winter Park cleared the street of the debris. The Forestry Department said it was not unusual for an old tree to lose a limb after gaining weight from the absorption of rainwater.

A few days later, Canterbury Road stayed in the news with a fire that destroyed a garage at the rear of the property at 1412. The historic house was recently restored by Tanya Glatt and Bryan Stephens. Fortunately, no one was hurt. The 1925 house was the first one in Orwin Manor Westminster to be placed on the Winter Park Historic Register and was designated in 2001.

Michael Galletta and Betsy Gwinn at 1501 Orange Avenue recently placed their 1940s house on the Winter Park Historic Register. There are now three Orange Avenue houses on the register and 29 in our neighborhood.

Our neighborhood lost another original house in April when Westchester Avenue was demolished for a new house. This is the ninth house to be demolished in our neighborhood. Hopefully the architectural design of the new house will be compatible with surrounding houses. The streets that have lost houses are Orange (2), Westchester (3), Pelham (2), Suffolk (1), Cavendish (1).


Check out the new metal handrails at the semi-circular steps at the front door of 1475 Berkshire Ave. Owners Meg Barclay and John Scholz felt there was a safety issue at the entrance and saw physical evidence that in the past there were handrails. Besides adding safety, they have been an aesthetically pleasing addition to their Winter Park Historic Register House. See if you agree.


Have you RRFB*ed at the crosswalk? It took about a half dozen work crews, but within a few nighttime hours the speed tables at the Orange Avenue crosswalk at The Park at Orwin Manor were slightly lowered. Now most vehicles can pass over it when doing the posted 30 mph. Prior to that there was a lot of noise from vehicles bottoming out or hitting their brakes when they spotted "Mt. Orwin." The new roadway configuration with two travel lanes, a center turn lane, and bike lanes combined with a lower speed limit (from 35 to 30) and speed tables has transformed this major transportation artery into a much safer street for drivers, pedestrians, flanking homeowners, and bicyclists. Long-time residents may remember that up to the late 1980s Orange Avenue had only two travel lanes with on street parking. *Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon in FDOT-speak.

As you all know, we are in a serious drought situation. It will be probably several weeks before the summer rains, so we need to be especially mindful of our water usage. As I drive through the neighborhood, I see irrigation systems running on all days of the week, and at all hours of the day. Orange County has a watering schedule: From March 9th through November 1st: Sundays and Thursdays for even addresses, Saturdays and Wednesdays for odd addresses, Tuesday and Fridays for non-residential properties. It is recommended by University of Florida to water before 10 am and after 4 pm. When you water during the hottest part of the day, up to 2/3rd of the water escapes through evaporation. Not only are you wasting money and water, your yard is getting a fraction of the water it should be getting.

And make sure the water is staying in the yard, not on driveways or streets – once again, so wasteful! When you water once, but deeply, the roots of all plants will get to be much more efficient in using water rather than watering multiple times, but shallowly.

You can be water conscious in the house as well – turn off faucets while brushing teeth, shaving, soaping up in the shower – when water is not actually being used. Collect shower water to use for watering plants, install water saving shower heads.

LET'S KEEP OUR SIDEWALKS CLEAR AND SAFE! A FRIENDLY REMINDER FOR OUR NEIGHBORS by OMA board member Bre-elle Ishtar

Why it matters: sidewalks connect our community. They keep kids safe walking to school, make space for strollers and wheelchairs, and provide a safe path for walkers, joggers, and pets. Let's all pitch in to keep them clear.

Here's how you can help:

- **1. Trim Back Hedges & Trees** keep sidewalks free from overhanging branches and overgrown plants.
- **2. Don't Block the Walk** avoid parking cars, bikes, or scooters across sidewalks.
- **3. Be Trash Bin Smart -** on collection days, keep bins off the walkway.
- **4. Sweep It Clean** leaves, branches, or storm debris? A quick sweep keeps the path safe.
- Report Sidewalk Hazards if you spot damaged or permanently blocked sidewalks, report them to city or county services.

We're all in this together. A clear sidewalk helps everyone—families, seniors, kids, and people with disabilities. Let's keep Orange County, Winter Park, and Orlando walkable, safe, and neighbor-friendly.
